

#### **Crossing Safety**

As we come back to school, now is a great time review with your child(ren) safety expectations for walking to and from school. Please make sure they understand to walk on the sidewalk, cross at cross walks, watch for traffic when they cross, and listen to adults who may be at crossings. Due to staffing shortages, we have had a few times when one of our crossings have not been able to be covered. Safety is one of our core values and we continue to do our best to fully staff our crossings. Thank you for reminding your child(ren) about safety as they walk to school each day!

#### BE A GOOD NEIGHBOR WHEN PARKING

Reminders about safety during our student drop-off and pick-ups at the beginning and end of the school day:

- ALL pedestrians must use crosswalks.
- A quick reminder that the speed limit is 20 miles per hour around our school before and after school. This speed will help us keep a close eye on our

Beagles and give us plenty of time to respond in case one of our students makes an unexpected choice.

#### At school Drop Off/Pick up

- Eight of our front parking spaces are marked with diagonal and vertical yellow stripes and are not to be used for parking during drop off and pick up.
- When dropping off students by car, please use the upper right lane and continue to pull all the way forward. Once students pass the mailbox, they may get out on the passenger side ONLY.
- Do not let children out of your vehicle until you pass the mailbox.
- Please keep the upper left lane open to through traffic.
- Please remember to never block the bus lane; wait at the road curbside if necessary.
- Children should be dropped off after 8:35 am as there is no earlier supervision in the car lane.
- Thank you for keeping handicap spaces open for designated vehicles.
- Please do not park in the small lot to the right of the bus lane, as this is staff parking

# Reminders for those who park on the surrounding neighborhood streets

- When turning from 162nd to 110th, please make sure to use your blinker and wait for the crossing guards to return before making your turn.
- Do not block any of the driveways, mailboxes, (or fire hydrants) of our neighbors

- Do not park on corners as it creates poor visibility at the crosswalks, making it hard to see small children who may not be as careful if they are running late. Park
- Only park your vehicle parallel with the street and faced in the direction of the lawful traffic flow.
- Plan for extra time and bring your patience and kindness.

## Three measures on the February 8 ballot to support excellence for every student

Local levies help bridge the funding gap between what the state provides our schools and what we actually need to support students. Local levies pay for staff at each school, technology for students and classrooms, help us maintain our schools and add classroom space.

Lake Washington School District is asking for three local levies on the February 8 ballot. Each measure will help support excellence for every student. Two measures renew current levies that are set to expire later this year. Propositions 1 and 2 will continue funding for school staff, programs, and opportunities for our students, like performing arts, extracurriculars and athletics. Proposition 3, our Building Excellence Construction Levy, will help us meet our current and future growth by adding classroom space across our fast-growing district.

**Kindergarten Registration** 

It will soon be time to begin Kindergarten registration for the 2022-23 school year. The initial registration period for children who will be five years old on or before August 31, 2022, will begin on February 24, 2022. Registration for all K-12 LWSD students is online. All necessary documents can be accessed on the LWSD website and completed documents can be uploaded securely. Parents who are unable to upload documents may send them by U.S. mail or drop them off at their neighborhood school. Important: While K-12 student registration will continue throughout the school year and summer. Parents are highly encouraged to register students as soon as possible. Registering early helps LWSD ensure that class sizes are balanced and adequate staff are hired in time for the new school year.




