School Description

Rockwell Elementary is a high performing school nestled in a thriving, international neighborhood. We have 572 students in grades K-5. We pride ourselves on providing students with the skills needed to become successful, kind, and productive members of our school and of our global community.

Rockwell has received Washington Achievement Awards over the past five years, most recently in the areas of English Language Acquisition, English Language Arts Growth, and Outstanding Achievement.

Our school community includes learners and their families from all over the world. At the time of this writing, there are 32 different languages, in addition to English, spoken by our students and their families. We reflect continuously upon the changing needs of our community and work to develop ways to support every child through EL parent partnerships, student-led anti-bullying work, and an engaged, supportive PTA. In August, 2018, Rockwell was awarded the prestigious National PTA School of Excellence designation in recognition of this work.

2018-19 School Goals

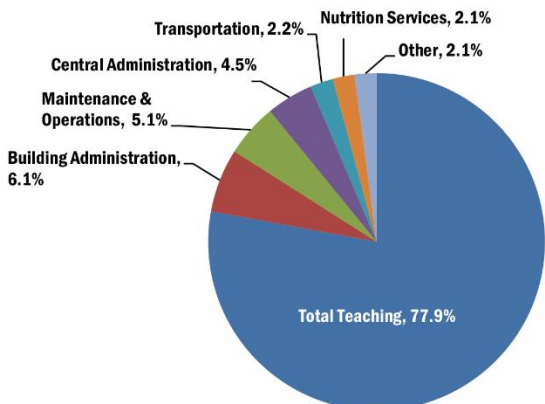
Teachers analyze data from the previous year and the beginning of the year to determine areas of strength and areas of growth.

- Grades K-2 Reading: 89.5% of students at standard on end of year DIBELS
- Grades 3-5 English Language Arts: 82% at standard
- Grades 3-5 Math: 84% at standard
- Grade 5 Science: 77% at standard
- Achievement gap: 50% of students receiving English Language Learner services will be at standard in English Language Arts
- School Effectiveness: Percentage of staff members who agree or strongly agree that "the school provides ample information to families about how to help students succeed in school" will maintain or exceed 90%.
- Attendance: Kindergarten students missing school for over 18 days in the school year will decrease from 16% for the 2017-2018 school year, to 10% in June 2019.
- Discipline: Instances of suspension for students receiving Specially Designed Instruction (SDI) will reduce from 17 during the 2017-2018 academic year to 9 or fewer during the 2018-2019 academic year.

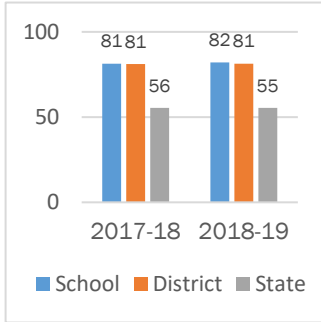

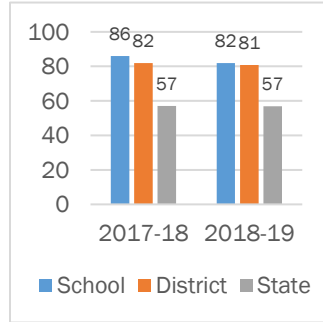

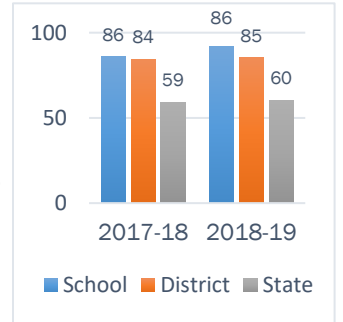
3rd Grade English Language Arts



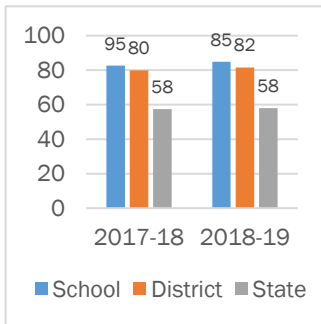
4th Grade English Language Arts



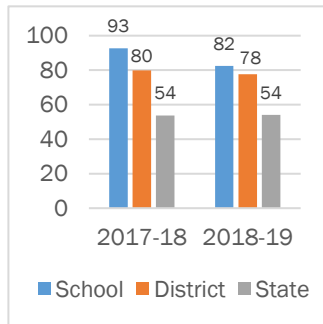
5th Grade English Language Arts



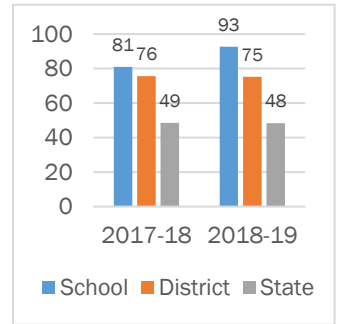
3rd Grade Math



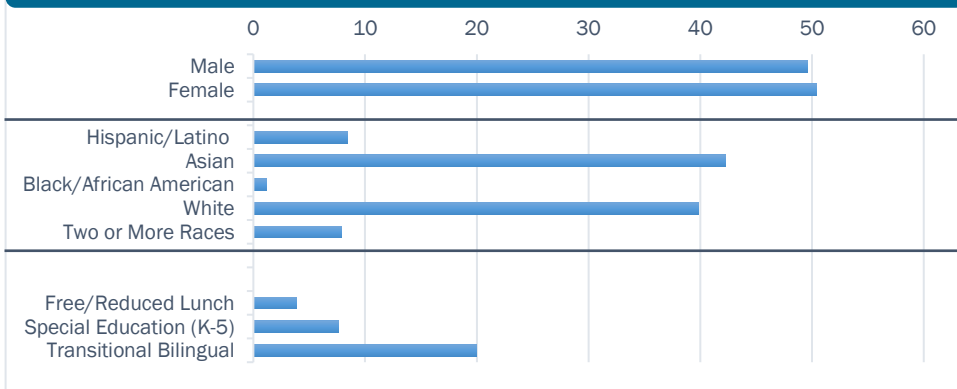
4th Grade Math
