Principal's Letter

All Means All at Rockwell Elementary: Continuing our Inclusion Work for All Learners in the 2021-2022 School Year

Dear Rockwell Families,

Good afternoon from the ranch, and happy Friday! I hope this message finds you and your family safe and well as we complete our first FULL week of the school year! Our Beagles may be a bit tired this afternoon as we continue to settle in and find our stamina, but they did a wonderful job, and I'm very proud of them.

Families: now that we are settling in to the new school year, I would like to share some exciting news about one of our major areas of focus for the year ahead. In the year to come, we will continue our work fostering inclusive classrooms and instruction at our school for all learners. We began this important work last Fall with the development of our brand new Inclusion room, through looking at ways in which we can provide greater support and access to grade-level classrooms for our students receiving Specially Designed Instruction, as well as through engaging in professional learning as a staff in the area of Universal Design for Learning (UDL). We will continue and grow upon this work in the year ahead, partnering with district leaders, the TIES Center at the University of Minnesota (the preeminent national organization on inclusive practices), and the University

of Washington Haring Center for Inclusive Education. Our work, along with that of the two other inclusion pilot schools (Twain Elementary and Kirkland Middle), will lay the foundation for greater inclusive practices in schools across our district.

...So what does this all mean? How are we working actively to create safe and inclusive classrooms at our school, and what will that work look like in the months to come? Here are some highlights:

- We will continue to look at ways in which all of our students, including learners receiving Specially Designed Instruction (SDI), can have greater access to their general education classroom, curriculum, and peers.
- We will continue our professional learning as a school team around inclusive practices, including the effective use of Universal Design for Learning (UDL). In fact, a film crew is going to record interviews with several of our teachers that will be part of a documentary on UDL to be shared nationally (more on this to come!).
- Professors and program specialists from the University of Minnesota,
 University of Washington, and our district will be joining us onsite to offer recommendations and guidance for our work.
- Our students in most grades will attend their IEP meetings, providing their input and voice to the process.
- We will look at ways in which we can provide universal supports for all students at our school (e.g., access to tools like Clickr7, a predictive text program).
- We'll be engaging in lessons with all of our students around inclusion, disabilities, and how to be a good friend and classmate to all students.
- We will be looking at ways in which we can offer interventions and supports for all students, responding to their learning and SEL needs in real-time.


I'm incredibly proud of our school team for their work in this area, as well as for their commitment to the success of every student we serve. Drop-Off / Pick-Up / Parking Lot

As we continue to get back into the groove of a new school year, here are a few reminders about the drop-off and pick-up process:

- Thank you to everyone who is walking, riding their bikes, or carpooling. We appreciate it!
- Please arrive no earlier than 8:35 and go directly to your line-up spot. Our playfields are closed before and after school.
- Buses only use the lane closest to the building.
- Drop off/pick-up is in the right lane of the upper lot. Please have all students exit from the right (passenger) side of your vehicle.
- The left lane of the upper lot is only for cars driving through or to park.
- Continuously pull forward please do not park or let your child out if the car in front of you is moving.
- Reserved spaces are for staff we have itinerant staff members who need to arrive just before the start of the day.
- Rockwell is an idle-free zone. Thank you for turning off your engines as you wait in the pick-up lane.

Highly Capable Services for Elementary and Middle School Students

Lake Washington School District (LWSD) will accept applications for Highly Capable programs from September 8 until 4:00 p.m. on October 1, 2021. Students must live in the Lake Washington School District to apply.

Please note: Pares of first-grade students attending LWSD schools should not apply during this application period. LWSD first-grade students are screened for Highly Capable Programs in their general education classrooms.

Too Sick for School

One of the best ways to avoid community transmission of COVID-19, and other infectious illness, is to stay home when you are sick. Students and school employees who have symptoms of infectious illness, such as influeza (flu) or COVID-19 should stay home and seek medical evaluation, which may include testing for COVID-19 and other respiratory infections.

While the school will no longer require an attestation form at the start of each day, we ask families to please answer the following questions at home before deciding to send your child to school. If you answer "YES" to any of the following questions, keep your student home and contact your school.

- Has your student been in close contact with anyone with confirmed COVID-19?
- 2. Does anyone in your household have COVID-19 like symptoms &/or is anyone in your household being tested for COVID-19?
- 3. Has your student or anyone in your household had a positive COVID-19 test for active virus in the past 10 days?

4. Within the past 14 days, has a public health or medical professional told your student to self-monitor, self-isolate or self-quarantine because of concerns about COVID-19?

If an administrator is not nearby or available to take your tip, you and your child can easily report tips on bullying, harassment, drugs, vandalism, threats of violence or any safety issue you're concerned about through Vector Alert. When you submit a tip, be sure to use our district's identification code: 1342 in your communication.





From the Archives: Rockwell's Ninth Principal - Kirsten Gometz (2011-2017) As the 10th Principal of Norman Rockwell elementary, I had the privilege of following a very dedicated, passionate, and student-centered leader: Kirsten Gometz. Principal Gometz served as the Chief Beagle from 2011-2017, and many elements of her principalship remain, such as our focus on equity, the beautiful planter boxes around our school, and our schoolwide focus on one of the most important aspects of Beagle Best: kindness. Kirsten was masterful at focusing on what our namesake Norman Rockwell referred to as "the joy of childhood," and our annual Halloween parade was a gala affair during her tenure. In the photos below, Principal Gometz poses with her son, Rory, as Star Wars legends Princess Leia and R2-D2 for one of the parades, joins a presentation by the student Anti-Bullying Action Committee (a group designed to make sure no kids are ever lonely or left out), and poses for one of our school's posters for the "Read" campaign. Kirsten now serves as the principal of Redmond Elementary.











Math Fun in Mrs. Gibson's Classroom! Students in Mrs. Gibson's room engaged in an art project to practice using number strips.
